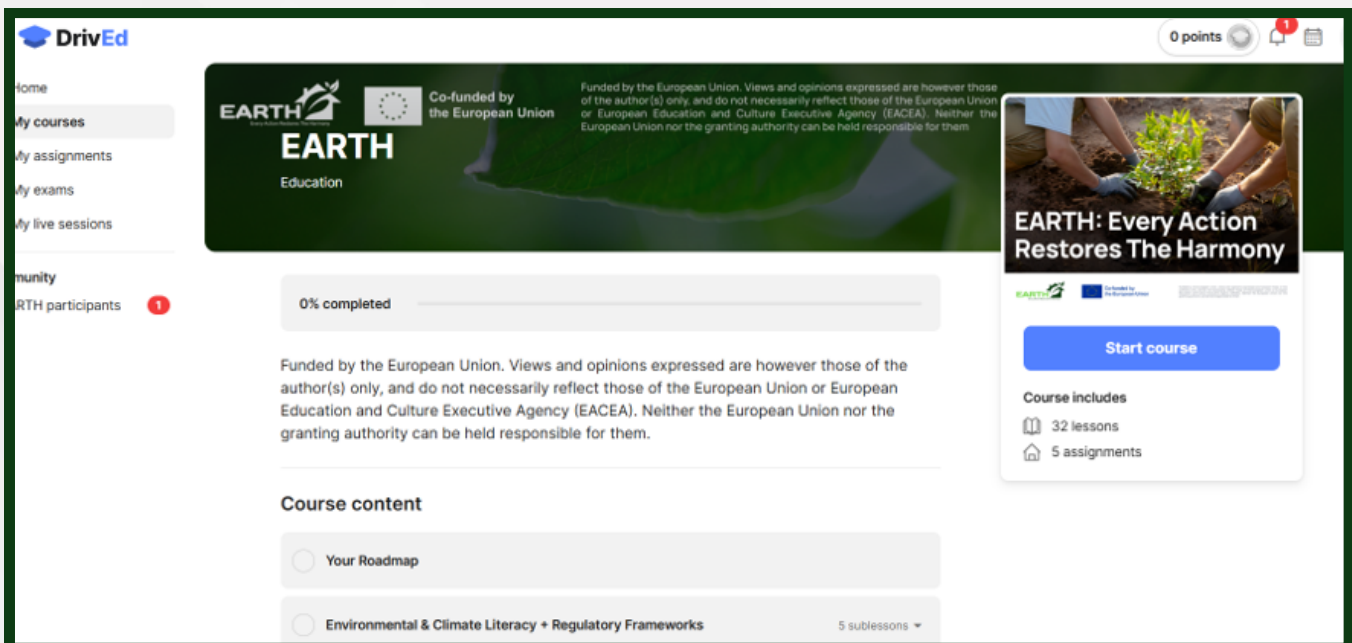
## Making Capacity Building Accessible

Designing solutions is not enough.  
They must be accessible.  
They must be usable.  
They must create real change.

Over the past months, the EARTH project – Every Action Restores The Harmony – has moved from designing a structured capacity-building programme to making it directly accessible to youth organisations.

The result is a key milestone of the project:  
the launch of the **DriveED LMS platform**.

This platform transforms the EARTH training methodology into a practical, digital learning environment where organisations can actively strengthen their capacities.

# From Knowledge to Practice

The DriveED LMS platform has been developed to respond to this need.

Through the platform, organisations can:

- Assess their organisational capacity and identify gaps
- Access modular training content tailored to real needs
- Apply practical tools for project design, communication, fundraising, and youth engagement

This is not just training.  
It is a structured pathway for organisational development.

## Who It Is For

The platform is designed for:

- Youth NGOs and grassroots organisations
- Youth workers, trainers, and volunteers
- Organisations aiming to strengthen their impact and sustainability

It supports organisations at different stages of development, from early capacity-building to more advanced strategic growth.

## A Continuous Learning Process

The EARTH approach is based on a simple but powerful logic:

Self-assessment → Learning → Application → Improvement

Through the LMS, this cycle becomes operational.

Organisations are not passive participants.

They actively engage, reflect, and evolve.

This ensures that learning is not temporary — but embedded in organisational practice.
